Golden Triangle Early College High School Program

February 2025

I received an invitation to present a workshop on time management to students at the Golden Triangle Early College High School Program. The early college high school at East Mississippi Community College was the first model in Mississippi. These programs offer students a non-traditional high school experience, where they can earn their high school diploma, as well as a career technical certificate or an associate's degree. Students from the Fall 2024 Professional Development in Social Work course and Spring 2025 Practice with Groups course were offered the opportunity to participate. Overall, seven social work students from our program volunteered to assist. Specifically, they each were responsible for facilitating a small group, including developing an introductory activity and leading the small group activities/topics based on instruction I provide to the large group of approximately 80 students. The high school students responded positively to the MSU students,

which resulted in a subsequent invitation to return the next academic year. Upon conclusion of the workshop, I debriefed with the social work students, where they articulated lessons learned related to group dynamics and working with youth. Students in the Practice with Groups course used the experience to inform an assignment in their current course.

Office of Undergraduate Research Symposium

April 2022

Social work students in a foundations research course worked independently and in groups to design either a quantitative or qualitative research proposal. Students were placed into groups following the solicitation of their individual preferences from a comprehensive list of broad areas. Groups were subsequently randomly assigned to either a quantitative or qualitative methodology to demonstrate how areas can be researched from different approaches. Individual work products included an annotated bibliography and literature review, which also engaged a peer review activity. After completing independent research in their broad area, students worked in their small groups to distill one research question and a research design based on their randomly designated methodology. The final work product was a group research proposal presented as a scholarly poster at the OUR symposium. Poster expectations included: one overall introduction/literature review, at least one clear research question, sampling strategy, measurement concepts, data collection methods, ethical considerations, limitations, and social work implications. Students also participated in a peer/self-evaluation of the group process.

Opening Doors NWFL Point in Time Census

January 2020 & January 2022

Social work students in Human Behavior in Organizations and Communities and Social Work Research Foundations served as volunteers with the Pensacola non-profit Opening Doors of Northwest Florida to complete a Housing and Urban Development census count of individuals experiencing homelessness in either sheltered or unsheltered situations. Following their involvement with the census students were required to engage in a creative and/or critical reflection employing the Objective, Reflective, Interpretive, Decisional (ORID) Model.

Poverty Simulation

February 2020, November 2021 & February 2022

Social work students in Human Behavior in Organizations and Communities and Social Work Research Foundations participated in the Missouri Community Action Network's Poverty Simulation with UWF students in nursing, education, criminal justice, and health promotion.
